

Scenario Cards - Teacher's Prompts

These notes are for your guidance, the scenarios aim to prompt discussions. There are no right or wrong answers but we do know lots of things can be managed by first aid, contacting the NHS help line or looking online. The 2 blank scenes can be used to encourage children to think of issues that may arise.

1. **Broken arm:** A&E
2. **Broken leg:** A&E
3. **Burn:** First aid - Hold under cold running water then wrap with clean film - Walk in centre or A&E
4. **Head injury / unconscious:** Call 999 then to A&E
5. **Verruca:** Medicine from your local pharmacy
6. **High temperature:** NHS help line
7. **Obesity:** GP
8. **Hay fever:** GP initially or a pharmacy
9. **Bee or wasp sting:** Grown up or pharmacy. Be aware of allergic reactions
10. **Sunburn:** Pharmacy
11. **Nits:** Pharmacy
12. **Constipation:** Ask a grown up. Encourage plenty of water, fruit and vegetable
13. **Cold:** Pharmacy
14. **Grazed knee:** First aid. A walk in centre if it is very dirty
15. **Ear ache:** GP
16. **Grazed elbow:** First aid. A walk in centre if it is very dirty
17. **Vomiting:** Pharmacy for rehydration solution
18. **Deep cut:** Walk in centre or GP, it may need stitches
19. **Head injury:** Ask a grown up
20. **Feeling sick after a meal:** Encourage fluid consumption. Consider a pharmacy
21. **Sprained ankle:** Walk in centre or minor injury centre
22. **Headache:** Self care (and turn the music down!)
23. **Bruise:** Self care
24. **Heart attack:** 999 or A&E - This is a real emergency!
25. **Nose bleed:** Ask a grown up
26. **Exema:** G.P. and pharmacy
27. **Cough:** Pharmacy
28. **Difficulty breathing:** GP or if really bad, A&E
29. **Bullying at school:** Ask a grown up or Childline
30. **Worries at home:** Ask a grown up or Childline
31. **Immunisations:** G.P. some are also handled by the school nurse
32. **Allergies:** School nurse, G.P. If really bad then 999 or A&E
33. **Foreign bodies in ears or nose:** Ask a grown up. Maybe visit A&E
34. **Diabetes:** You may have children in your school with diabetes who will have a specific plan of care. Your school nurse will be able to talk to children further about this.
35. **Chicken pox or measles:** G.P. and pharmacy
36. **Epilepsy:** You may have children in your school with epilepsy who will have a specific plan of care, about medication administration and management of fits. Your school nurse will be able to talk to children further about this.
